Cars in Car Park	There are always cars coming in and out of the car park Each week athletes are invited to leave the sportshall and go for a run around the school grounds	Anyone who uses the car park	Low	Just to remind people to look carefully before crossing the road from the car park to school entrance and when returning to the parking area from the run around the grounds	None. All the children going out for the run wear Hi-Viz vests and the ratio of adults to children is never more than 1 to 6.
The grounds	As above plus the conditions off road may be muddy	The athletes on the run-out	Low	One of the coaches assesses the route prior to the session to ensure it is suitable and safe	The adults are spaced out amongst the group to remind athletes of any hazards and no child is permitted to run ahead of the lead coach or be behind the last coach
Training area (sports hall)	None really – there is always the potential of floor being wet/slippy, previous users not having stored equipment safely. Lighting and heating need to be checked.	Anyone who is in the hall	Low	Check that any equipment left by previous users is safely stowed including dividing curtains, floor is dry and relatively clean. Any obstacles removed	None



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Fire Escape	If blocked a potential risk	Anyone who is in the hall	Low	Remind children to not leave bags in front of fire escape	None
Young athletes leaving sports hall	Risk of being by themselves in the dark. Risk of being unsupervised leaving the school grounds	All young athletes	Low	All children have to be signed out by a parent or given permission to walk home	None
